One person reads the story out loud exactly as written, emphasizing the words LEFT and RIGHT.

Every time the reader says LEFT, everyone passes their gift one person to the left.

Every time the reader says RIGHT, everyone passes their gift one person to the right.

When the story ends, you keep the gift you're holding.
